#### Introduction

### **Key Stage 3**

There is a focus on developing the literacy, numeracy & study skills required for GCSE. Students also have a 60-minute PHSE lesson which includes our RSE curriculum.

#### **Key Stage 5**

The Skegness Academy Sixth Form offers a broad and balanced 16-19 curriculum which includes a range of both Level 2, Level 3 vocational and A Level course to

ensure all students can follow a personalised learning pathway.

As well as a comprehensive academic programme, the students also participate in planned super curriculum and enrichment sessions as well as dedicated independent study time. The super curriculum and enrichment programme encompasses a wide range of activities aimed at improving their employability and developing their life skills to support their Post 18 options. Activities include cooking on a budget, effective revision skills, budgeting, and financial planning, UCAS support and

university talks, employability and interview techniques and making

positive life choices. Opportunities for leadership include sports leaders, SF ambassadors and SF student leadership team.

The Sixth Form has strong careers support which includes a dedicated week of work experience for all Year 12 students to support them with the application of their employability skills
